- Brazil's CRIRSCO 'action team':
 - Dr Roberto Villas-Boas, CETEM (Centre for Mineral Technology of the Ministry of Science & Technology)
 - Prof.Dr. Giorgio de Tomi, Director of Centre for Responsible Mining, University of Sao Paulo

- Geologists
 - One Federal Institute that represents all provincial entities and associations
- Mining Engineers
 - Three Federal Institutes that share national representation of mining engineers

1. Establish a new council (committee) including all these entities as well as the government agencies and the national engineering council
2. Align the new council with CRIRSCO's principles and standards
3. Use CRIRSCO experience and assistance from Chile to guide development path both formally and with stock exchange regulators
4. Present the results at the next CRIRSCO meeting with an application to join CRIRSCO

- Start by setting up an informal committee with representation from all the institutes, and other interested parties (government, university, industry)
- Use this committee to define a Brazilian CRIRSCO code, with CP recognition of appropriate membership classes of each of the professional organisations
- Apply for CRIRSCO membership
- In parallel, formalise committee as a 'not-for-profit' association
- In parallel, apply for stock exchange recognition
